## This funding will be used to

- Build teacher capability in data literacy, curriculum & high yield teaching strategies in English, Mathematics.
- Improve percentage of students achieving English (Prep-6) >85% C (or equivalent) and above in Maths, English and Science.
- Increase percentage of students achieving at an A or B level in English consistently across all year levels Prep - Year 6.
- Literacy Continuum - 85% of students achieving their end of year cluster in Reading Texts and Comprehension

## Our initiatives include

- Teachers receive planning days to analyse their own classroom data to identify individual student needs. These planning days are used to unpack C2C units of work and understand the literacy demands of each unit relating to the achievement standards of the Australian Curriculum.
- Engage regional support staff to enhance pedagogy in classrooms, Early Years Coach (Age Appropriate Pedagogies), Behaviour Coach (Positive Behaviour for Learning).
- Boost teacher aide allocation to support inclusivity across the whole school and intervention programs.
- Engage a Students with Disabilities teacher to support students, teachers and parents with intervention and support. Liasing with third party providers to ensure all students access the curriculum at level.

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Releasing teachers for planning days throughout each term to work with the Principal - \$5000
- Funding of 0.15FTE for Head of Curriculum - \$14000
- Additional teacher aide funding and allocation to support students in class - \$6802
- Building capability of teachers thorough professional learning opportunities focussed on English, Mathematics and Behaviour Mangement - \$5000
